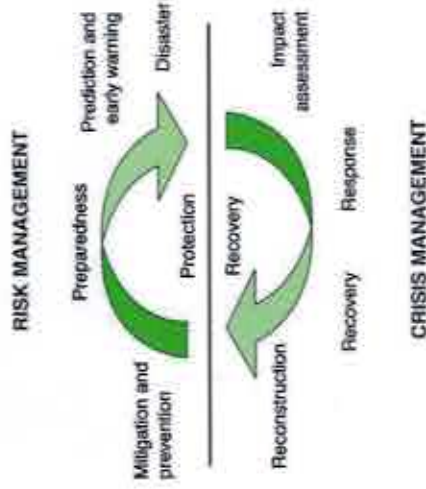
## Regional Training Initiative (RTI)

The Regional Training Initiative is a FEMA-sponsored training program being implemented by the PRDPC. Our goal is to provide hazard training to first responders and civilians within the Pacific Region, including American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Hawaii, and Republic of the Marshall Islands.

# Types of Training

## Incident Command System (ICS) Training

FEMA-certified, ICS personnel only establish when disaster occurs. Designed to provide emergency responders with understanding of duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of each system



## Facilities Security Officer (FSO) Training

Day-to-day security operations MARAD-approved. Seaport security is for individuals who have an overall responsibility for a single seaport security plan including all terminals within a seaport



## Security Guard Training Course Curriculum

In 2010, the Legislature established new training requirements for guards in HRS chapter 463, Act 208. Effective July 1, 2013 new HRS section 463-10.5(a) requires all guards, and all agents, operatives, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity or government agency who act in a guard capacity to register with the Board of Private Detectives and Guards ("Board"), and (among other things) meet certain training requirements prior to acting as a guard.
